Introducing: The AGST Alliance Programs Committees

To oversee the development and administration of our programs – currently in Theology and Education – a program committee works closely with each program director. Each committee meets about twice a year, but there is also a good deal of interaction and decision-making between meetings.

These committees meet in different modes: the Education Programs Committee meets face-to-face (with comments from the non-Singapore member received beforehand), and usually with freshly brewed coffee; while the Theology Programs Committee meets via Skype – evening for most of us but early morning for Terry in USA.

The agendas? The committees make decisions relating to such areas as

- The format and module topics for the MTh programs.
- Confirming students for entry into the MTh programs, and candidates into the PhD programs.
- Updating on student progress and problems.
- Ensuring appropriate academic standards.
- Approving recommendations for students to graduate.

In the MTh(Theology) program

Forthcoming modules

The on-campus sessions of the next module in the MTh(Theol) program, Issues of contextualisation in Asia, take place 30 Nov – 4 Dec., facilitated by Dr David and Mrs Rosemary Harley (UK), on the campus of Bangkok Bible Seminary. About eight students will participate.

 Pray for smooth logistics for all – the students, David and Rosemary – and for safe and stress-free travel, good interactions, and freedom from sicknesses. The first MTh(Theol) module in 2010 will be Contemporary Asian theologies, 1-5 March, facilitated by Dr Steve Taylor (Bangkok Bible Seminary), in Kuala Lumpur.

Relevant thesis topics needed

Meanwhile, several of the MTh(Theol) students are now thinking about their thesis focus, with a view to starting their thesis research as soon as they complete their last module. They need topics which will be significant for building God's Kingdom and Church in Asia – and we need to find suitable supervisors able to work with them.

New cycle from mid 2010

We thank God for a worthwhile first cycle of the MTh(Theol) program. Now, the module topics for a new cycle of the MTh(Theol) program (from June 2010) are being shaped up, and the program promoted.

- Pray that information on this program will get into the hands of church leaders who will benefit from participating.
- Pray for Dr Sunny Tan as he lines up module facilitators and oversees practical details.

First MTh(Education) graduate

Dr Chuah Seong Peng (Malaysia; pictured with his family) won't forget Sunday 6 September quickly. On that day he was inducted into the role of bivocational pastor in his home church, Holy Light Presbyterian Church (English) in Johor Bahru – and graduated with his AGST Alliance Master of Theology (Education) degree.

Seong Peng acknowledges how his MTh(Ed) has equipped him for his pastoral role: "My AGST-MST study has provided me with a holistic education that has helped me in my personal growth and equipped me to be a better educator-leader in the church."

- Thank God for Seong Peng's response to his call on his life. Pray with Seong Peng that "as I continue on my journey with God, I will know the greater things yet to come."
- Pray for two other MTh(Ed) students from Seong Peng's cohort: one has just submitted a revision of her thesis for re-examination; and one needs to submit her thesis ASAP.
- The five MTh(Ed) students in the second cohort all need good time management and motivation to ensure they finish well. Once the pressure of the modules came off (in late 2008), they all have made much slower progress than expected.
- Pray, for good progress for our six PhD(Ed) and one PhD(Theology) candidates, at different stages in their research programs.



New MTh(Education) commences in January

We are on target to commence the new cycle of the MTh(Ed) in early 2010. The revised focus of the program is reflected in its new title: Master of Theology (Education) in Spiritual formation and Discipleship.

Currently, about six students are either accepted or their applications are being processed – but we would benefit from another 3-4 at least to make the program really viable. We are anticipating that I-2 participants from the Middle East will be in the program, as part of the partnership between AGST Alliance and the Middle East Association for Theological Education (MEATE).

The on-campus sessions of the first module, Education in Christian faith communities: Overview and foundations, facilitated by Dr Allan Harkness, take place 23 Feb – 2 March, at East Asia School of Theology (Singapore).

- Thank God for the potential of this MTh(Ed) program, now entering its third cycle.
- Pray for the students preparing to commence the program in early 2010, especially as they plan strategies to be able to give adequate time to their studies alongside their ongoing ministries.
- Pray for news about our programs to get out to the people who would benefit from them. We have advertised recently in several Christian publications, but personal contact and endorsement is often the most effective channel.

Personnel changes

Ms Siau Hoi Ching (Klang, Malaysia) has played an important role as our AGST Alliance accounts clerk this year. She has been responsible for ensuring our current financial records have been entered into our new accounting software, and preparing them for our recent (and successful!) audit.

Hoi Ching has stepped down from this role; and is replaced by Mr and Mrs Lim Kong Eong and Melissa (Kuala Lumpur). Kong Eong and Melissa have just graduated from programs at Malaysia Baptist Theological Seminary (MBTS), and are taking on roles in KL for MBTS. We are grateful that they are willing to supplement their MBTS ministry with our accounts work.

 Thank God for those who serve 'behind the scenes' in AGST Alliance: Kong Eong and Melissa, and Ms Michelle Seetoh (Registrar). Their roles don't take a

- lot of time, but are crucial for the smooth (and somewhat complex) administration of AGST Alliance.
- Pray for Melissa and Kong Eong in their first couple of months, as they undergo training in the accounting software, and enter the financial data from our first four years into our system.

Successful audit

A major milestone for us has been to get our AGST Alliance financial records up to an acceptable level of accuracy and transparency. We rejoice that we have successfully passed our first audit – for the 2008-09 financial year.

Thank God for the successful audit — and for Ms Lew Chit Moi, our honorary accountant, whose professional competence overseeing 'the big picture' aspects of our multi-national financial structure has been instrumental in getting our accounts to this point.

Bangkok doesn't agree with all

In November 2008, Dr Pieter Theron (right) and his wife Haniki were in Bangkok, where Pieter was facilitating our MTh(Ed) module on Educational Leadership. Their time in Bangkok coincided with the closure of Bangkok International Airport – and they spent a somewhat horrendous and expensive week trying to get out of Thailand to start their planned holiday with family in their home country of South Africa before returning to Mongolia, where they serve.

This November, Pieter and Haniki have again visited Bangkok, this time for a conference of the leaders of their organisation. A relaxed afternoon visit by the conference delegates to an elephant show turned into catastrophe when an elephant threw Pieter and a colleague into the air. Both men were injured, Pieter very seriously. We praise God that Pieter is recovering well, he is unlikely to have major long-term debilities, and he and Haniki should be able to leave Bangkok by the end of November.
